### Introduction

There are a few ways you may wish to explore to help fund improvements to your home.

### Nest

The Nest scheme offers advice and support on energy efficiency, budgeting, energy tariffs and benefit checks to homes across Wales. In addition the scheme offers qualifying householders (i.e. those receiving a means-tested benefit etc) a range of improvement measures to help heat their homes more efficiently and save them money on their energy bills.

### Welsh Government Warm Homes Scheme

The Welsh Government Warm Homes scheme provides insulation and efficient heating systems to the homes of households who are struggling with the cost of high energy bills, making homes warmer, more comfortable and more affordable to heat.

Welsh Government Warm Homes (Arbed) is funded by the Welsh Government and managed by Arbed am Byth. The aim of the scheme is to install appropriate energy efficiency measures in properties across Wales, to help people who are struggling to effectively heat their home.

### Western Power Distribution Power Up Scheme

Western Power provides four Power Up advice hubs across their operating regions to support vulnerable customers and address fuel poverty. The Energy Saving Trust delivers the Power Up service across South Wales and provides advice to customers on the Western Power priority service register by phone and via home visits.

The advice Power Up scheme helps customers save energy, reduce their bills and benefit from a range of additional support services.

### Renewable Heating Initiative (RHI) / Clean Heat Grant

The Domestic Renewable Heat Incentive (Domestic RHI) is a UK government financial incentive to promote the use of renewable heat. People who successfully join the scheme and stick to its rules receive quarterly payments for seven years for the amount of clean, green renewable heat it's estimated their system produces. From 2022 this will change to the Clean Heat Grant and, instead of a 'tariff' award for heat produced, there will be an opportunity to claim grants to support the cost of the installation of renewable heating systems.
